This was a tough quarter for us so I am looking forward to the upcoming months!

We did well in the 1st Quarter with violent crime – 19% reduction. Property crime killed us! We are up 35% in property crime and most of that is theft from cars and theft from buildings. Please make sure you take a look at the crime tips and share them with friends, family and co-workers.

Our crime trends continued in March. We had a great decrease in violent crime – 38% reduction. We had a 33% increase in property crime - and again - that is mainly due to theft from cars and theft from buildings. Please remember to report all suspicious activity to the Police.

Crime Watch Tips

Reducing the Opportunity of Larcenies from Autos

- Park in well-lighted areas
- Lock your doors.
- Do not leave valuables in the car!!!!
- Mark or slash inspection stickers and city decals.
- Put valuables in the trunk before you get to your destination.
- Do not use your glove box as a “safe”.
- DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING IN PLAIN VIEW (toll change, food, gym bag, etc.)
- DO NOT LEAVE THE MOUNT TO YOUR GPS AFFIXED TO YOUR WINDSHIELD!!! (The criminal will guess that there is a GPS in your car if he/she sees the mount.)
- DO NOT LEAVE YOUR ELECTRONICS PLUGGED IN!! (We have had cars broken into with IPODs or GPSs hidden under the seat or in the glove box but they were still plugged in – thieves are looking in your cars)

Reducing the Opportunity of Thefts from Buildings.

- Please ensure that you know and can trust those you invite into your homes – especially during parties.
- If you are having a party – do not allow access to your entire home. Lock valuables such as jewelry and cash in rooms not accessible to your guests.
- If you are allowing a repairman or cleaning person into your home or business – use a reputable business and ensure that someone accompanies them at all times.

What's going on in your neighborhood?

Oregon Hill

Overall decrease in crime of 57% in March. (3 crimes 'vs the 7 in March of '08).

On March 25th, between the hours of midnight and 2:30 am, a female was assaulted at 311 S. Cherry in an attempt robbery. Victim fought back by spraying pepper spray in the victim's eyes and he fled the scene. Suspect was described as a white male with a beard wearing a green jacket. The other 2 crimes were larcenies – a purse was stolen from a car in the 700 block of Idlewood and a camera was stolen at 334 S. Pine.

Jackson Ward

Overall decrease in crime of 25% in March. (15 crimes 'vs the 20 in March of '08)

Jackson Ward had no violent crime in March. On March 24th, between the hours of 6am – 5:30pm, a residence in the 100 block of W. Clay was broken into and electronics were stolen. There was a car stolen in the 100 block of E. Clay between March 16th and 17th. The other crimes were a mixture of shoplifting, theft from buildings and theft from autos and there really is no pattern. Please see crime tips.

Monroe Ward

Overall increase in crime of 92% in March. (27 crimes 'vs the 14 in March of '08)

On March 11, a female was robbed of her purse by her boyfriend – arrest has been made in this case.

Between March 6th and March 8th, the building at 10 E. Franklin was broken into and several laptop computers were stolen. Monroe Ward was hit hard with property crime: thefts from buildings, thefts from cars and 3 cars were stolen.
